I really enjoyed this positive post that someone shared on their personal Facebook page after their friend/family member received care in our St. Pete dental center. She tagged our college in the post, which is what drew our attention to it.

The dental center in St. Pete was the second "satellite"

dental center the college opened; the first was in Jacksonville. The St. Pete center opened in downtown St. Petersburg in 1991 and had a focus on taking care of the dental needs of low-income, elderly patients.

The center moved to its current location on the Seminole campus of St. Petersburg College in October 2005. The center houses an Advanced Education in General Dentistry program and, last year, completed 10,273 patient visits. They have two full-time and three part-time faculty (plus a large group of courtesy faculty from the community), 12 residents and 17 staff members.

The center is currently preparing for an accreditation visit on February 17, 2015.
