

SPOTLIGHT ON Standard 3 Faculty & Staff

Standard 3 focuses on faculty and staff and Clay Walker is taking the lead on this standard. Some of the areas of focus include:

- There must be a sufficient number of faculty and staff, appropriately distributed, to meet the mission and goals of the college.
- There should be a robust faculty development program in place that improves teaching, learning, retention and job satisfaction.
- Shared governance should be an integral component of the college and university so that faculty share in decision making.
- There must be a defined evaluation process that ensures measurement of faculty performance.
- The dental school has to have a clearly communicated process for promotion and tenure.
