Zipcar: Get a car when you need it! UF faculty, staff, and students can sign up for accounts for personal driving, while faculty and staff can also use their departmental account for official business. Zimride: Going my way? Give a ride or get a ride with Zimride, which provides a ride sharing platform exclusively for UF faculty, staff, and students. Share a daily commute, a ride to the airport, or even a lift out of town with a fellow Gator. Users' identities are verified via their GatorLink account, so you know who you're riding with.
