Proposals	<p>Request to move IPE class assignment from DEN8018: Professionalism in Patient Care and Practice Management IV -- to DEN8019: Interdisciplinary Learning IV</p> <p>Request to move oral examination from DEN7961: Clinical Examination I to DEN6302C: Introduction to Clinical Diagnosis and Treatment Planning -- in Spring 2019.</p>	<p>Dr. Sposetti explained the rationale to move the 4DN IPE - Preparedness for Practice: Interprofessional Communication and Opioid prescribing assignment utilizing the PDMP from DEN8018: Professionalism in Patient Care and Practice Management IV to DEN8019: Interdisciplinary Learning IV for sustainability.</p> <p>Dr. Sposetti reminded the committee that this assignment was approved as a pilot case assignment and the request is to move it into the ISL stream and officially approve it as part of the core curriculum. A. Tow reported that students are currently using the PDMP in clinical oral surgery rotations.</p> <p>Dr. Delgado reviewed a proposal to move the oral examination portion of DEN7961 as the assessment for DEN6302C in Spring 2019; moving the operative psychomotor exam to DEN7744L; and retaining the Clinical Orientation in DEN7961L or moving it to DEN7016 which already includes orientation to the TEAM program occurs. Student members felt more time should be devoted to students completing comprehensive oral examinations. A significant portion of this proposal would require a change in the published Academic Calendar. Students would postpone the break week by two days to take the oral exam and return two days later so the dates would change but not the student time off. Childs revised the DEN6128: Host Defense debriefing summary. Dr. Chan assumed the Course Director position when Dr. Wallet moved. He is anxious to begin planning for the next course offering. A. Tow felt strongly that the Host Defense course has significant overlap with biochemistry, general pathology and periodontology and is too detailed for dental students. He expressed students would be better served with more pathology and an emphasis on general medicine than memorizing a plethora of receptors.
