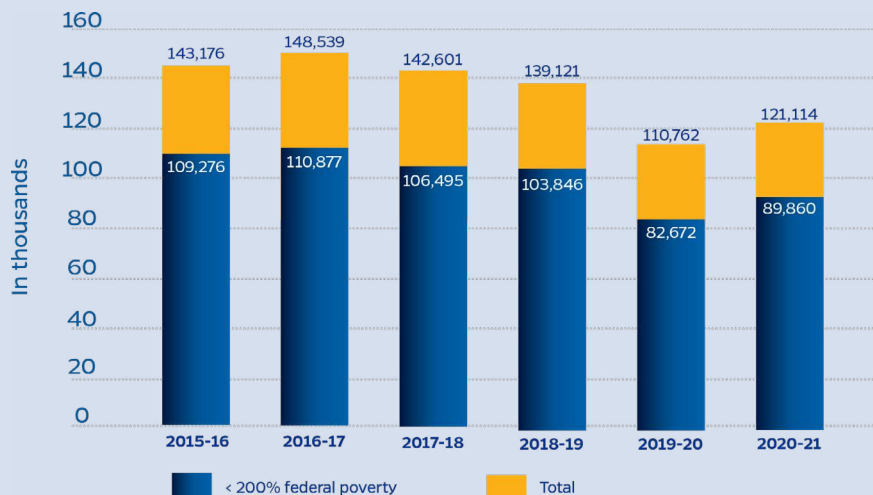

The **UF College of Dentistry** is the only publicly funded dental school in Florida and a national leader in dental education, research and clinical care.

About 90 new dentists and 56 dental specialists graduate each year, with most choosing to practice in Florida. The college offers residency training in eight dental specialties recognized by the American Dental Association and nine programs total: endodontics, esthetic dentistry, oral and maxillofacial pathology, oral and maxillofacial radiology, oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthodontics, pediatric dentistry, periodontics and prosthodontics.
