# Gator Dentist Today

The latest edition of our college's magazine, Gator Dentist Today, is here! Check it out online for a really nice recap about how our college has persevered through the COVID-19 pandemic, and catch up on the latest college, development and alumni affairs news, including an awesome new fund, the Dr. Cecil White <u>Jr. Scholars Fund</u>, to support students at the college who have demonstrated a commitment to breaking down barriers, and including and welcoming individuals from underrepresented ethnic or socioeconomic groups that are also underrepresented in the dentistry profession.





#### Dr. Duncan is the college's first artificial-intelligence focused hire.

Duncan joined the college in mid-March and is helping to guide and support UFCD in the development of the college's vision for Artificial Intelligence and AI-related research initiatives and goals. He came to the University of Florida from the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory in California where he spent the last three years as a software developer, and his academic home is the Department of Community Dentistry and Behavioral Science.

Dr. Duncan brings more than 15 years of experience developing and using biomedical ontologies and health informatics, as well as computer programming. He is well-versed in dental research, having led the development of the open-source Oral Health and Disease Ontology and served as co-investigator of several NIH-funded projects, including one on the application of dental data for clinical research. Some of his recent research includes the National Microbiome Data Collaborative funded by the Department of Energy, Immuno-Oncology Translation Network and a National Cancer Institute-funded cooperative agreement during his time at Roswell Park, also focusing on Immuno-Oncology.

He has previously collaborated with UF's Department of Health Outcomes and Biomedical Informatics and will continue to work with the group while also partnering with other AI faculty and staff across UF and UF Health.

Dr. Duncan will focus primarily on projects and research initiated by our faculty such as improving patient outcomes and prognoses in a range of oral, dental/craniofacial diseases and conditions, developing methods to warehouse and utilize our electronic dental health records and strengthening interprofessional care teams. He'll also serve as a mentor to predoctoral, Ph.D. and postdoctoral students and residents on artificial intelligence-related projects.

AUGUST 30, 1988 - FEBRUARY 24, 2022



#### How to Retain Mail


Mail in your 'Inbox' and 'Sent Items' older than 1,095 days will automatically be moved to the 'Deleted Items' folder. Mail that you wish to keep permanently must be moved to a folder created directly under your mailbox itself. Mail that remains in your 'Inbox', 'Sent Items', or a sub-folder of either will be automatically deleted by the email retention policy.

In the example below, a new folder is created for indefinite retention called 'Retain Permanently'. Follow the instructions below in order to create your 'Retain Permanently' folder. You may also include sub-folders within the 'Retain Permanently' folder. For example: one folder for Inbox mail and one for Sent.

#### Creating a Folder

#### Step 1:

To create a folder to permanently retain email, it must be located in the root 'Mailbox', **NOT** under your 'Inbox'. Your root mailbox will be shown as your email address by default.



Please note, emails in folders under your inbox will NOT be retained. It would be best drag ALL folders underneath your root mailbox (denoted above, which shows your email address by default.)

On July 1, UF's automatic email retention will shift to three years. This means that anything older than three years in your inbox or sent folders will be deleted on July 1. Moving forward, the email system will continuously delete items older than three years in those folders.

#### Why does this matter?

- If you've been here awhile, there are likely older emails you'll want to keep for various reasons.
- HIPAA related emails must be retained for six years.
- FERPA related emails must be retained for five years.
- In the next two months, you'll need to do some email organization to ensure you're keeping the emails you need to and want to.

And on July 1, 2022, <u>Daniel W. McNeil</u>, Ph.D., will join our college as professor and chair of the Department of Community Dentistry and Behavioral Science and the Parker E. Mahan Endowed Professor. Dr. McNeil also had a short stint in Gainesville as a trainee early in his career for four years from 1981-1985, including a behavioral dentistry/medicine postdoctoral fellowship with our college. He joins UFCD after over 25 years at West Virginia University in Morgantown, where he is currently an Eberly Distinguished Professor with faculty appointments in the Department of Psychology and the Department of Dental Public Health and Professional Practice.

# Goodbye

While bittersweet, we also bid farewell to two of UFCD's finest, Dr. Arthur Nimmo and Dr. Donald Cohen.

Dr. Nimmo is is already enjoying his retirement, spending his time with his wife, Dr. Susan Nimmo, children, grandchildren and will devote more time to piano, Pilates, gardening, travel, and cooking. Dr. Nimmo officially retired May 2 as an emeritus professor following 39 years as a dedicated dental educator. Nimmo joined the college in 1999 as a tenured professor. He served as chair of the Department of Prosthodontics from 1999 to 2005 and from 2010 to 2011. Nimmo was appointed as director of the predoctoral implant dentistry program in 2009 and served in this capacity until his retirement. Nimmo contributed to the education of more than 3,200 general dentists and countless prosthodontic specialists on the use of implants in dental care during his career, and has been active at the national level, serving as president of the American College of Prosthodontists from 1999 to 2000, Commissioner on the ADA Commission for Dental Accreditation from 2001 to 2005, and as president of the American Board of Prosthodontics from 2016 to 2017.

After 20 years of dedicated service to UF and our college, Dr. Cohen will be retiring in August 2022. Dr. Cohen is a professor and the chair of the Department of Oral & Maxillofacial Diagnostic Sciences, which includes the divisions of Oral & Maxillofacial Radiology, Oral Medicine, and Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology, and related clinics that offer services for patients and for practitioners. Dr. Cohen is a national leader in his specialty and is the immediate past president of the American Academy of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology. He has received numerous teaching awards, including several college and university-wide, and is a sought-after speaker, having given hundreds of lectures on the topics of oral medicine and oral pathology.
