



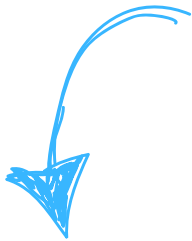

#### RESPONSIBILITIES

- ▶ Responsibilities include didactic, preclinical and clinical instruction in operative dentistry to the DMD program and graduate programs, including serving as a course director.
- ▶ The assistant/associate professor responsibilities include participation in intramural faculty practice, excellence in academic pursuits, service and the opportunity for participation in the development of departmental research and/or other scholarly activities.

#### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- ▶ DDS, DMD or equivalent dental degree.

#### PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- ▶ Post-graduate training in operative dentistry from a CODA-accredited institution.
- ▶ Teaching experience that has prepared the candidate to be a course director in operative dentistry.
- ▶ Clinical practice experience.
- ▶ Applicants should possess the skills and knowledge to provide clinical coverage in all aspects of general dentistry.
- ▶ As well as being a strong clinician, applicants should be organized, open-minded, dedicated to teaching students according to the guidelines set forth by the department, proficient with technology and the use of electronic health records, abreast of current evidence-based dentistry and possess excellent communications skills.

#### UF AND THE COLLEGE OF DENTISTRY

The University of Florida, a member of the AAU, is the largest and most comprehensive public university in Florida. The UF Academic Health Center and its six colleges are co-located on the Gainesville campus, with additional sites across Florida and internationally.

The UF College of Dentistry was established in 1972 and is a leader in oral health education, clinical care, research and service. With 12 degree and certificate programs, it is one of only a handful of U.S. dental schools with residency training in the majority of clinical dental specialties recognized by the American Dental Association. The college boasts a robust research enterprise that has ranked in the top 10 in NIH funding every year since 2000.

Through the UF Statewide Network for Community Oral Health, the college provides oral health care for patients from all 67 counties in Florida each year, including its five college-owned dental centers and 10+ community partners.
